



After attending a Mercy literacy class, he can now read write. "I have fornotten my



Spirits Lifted

Jeanne attends a small rural school Mercy Kidz staff visits these schools is updating photos of the students. It's not always easy to get a genuine, relaxed smile, but Jeanne's sweet spirit radiated on her face. Some would think it might be difficult for her to smile since she has no use of her legs and is dependent on someone to carry her to school and throughout the school day (the hilly school location makes a wheelchair unmanageable even if one was available). On photo day, the pastor proudly retrieved her from her classroom, and as he carried her they enjoyed a friendly, laughter occurrence. Finding Peace

Monoara Begum is a mother of 4 children. Her younger daughter Shila, reads in the nearest Madrasa (an Islamic school) where Mercy installed a water well. Collecting freshwater was challenging for Monoara. In her 30 years of marriage she has had to walk for miles every day to retrieve drinking water. She had to collect water, cook for the family, and prepare her husband for work and her children for school. All of these tasks must be done before dawn. Sometimes she cannot sleep peacefully for the stress of collecting water the next day.

After the well installation at her daughter's school, Monoara found peace in her mind. "I wonder how Talitha Koumi (Mercy's local partner) thought to install a deep tube well at the Madrasa? We never heard that people from other beliefs could help us! This is a beautiful moment for me, for the others too! If you want, you can share something more about Jesus".
